Plant Health and COVID-19

In light of the health emergency that the SARS-CoV-2 pandemic has caused in Mexico and the world, agriculture is one of the activities that has shown greater resilience and has produced the urgently needed food in a heavily collapsed global economy. The **Mexican Journal of Phytopathology (MJP)** wishes to honor all those who remained active in the field in their corresponding areas of competence despite the health risks that this represents. It is also intended to provide a documented memory, bearing in mind that information about the rural environment has been restrictive or limited. The scientific rigor will be subordinated to the truthful and human experience in those contributions coming from participants without the scientific profile. This will be a non-exclusive publication in a fair proportion with the current COVID-19 experience. In this spirit, the MJP:

CALLS UPON

Researchers, teachers, students, agricultural technicians, businessmen, plant health officers and producers involved in agricultural activities to make contributions based on social, scientific, productive, clinical, psychological experiences, etc. under the framework of phytosanitary activities, not limited to phytopathology. The modality includes **Phytopathological Note, Review, Brief Review, Letter to the Editor** and **Opinion Notes**.

All the contributions will be reviewed and assessed based on their documentary or scientific contribution by an *ad hoc* team of MJP editors. All the modalities will have a maximum of 10 pages. Special cases will be considered. The contributions will be published in a **SPECIAL ISSUE** with DOI record. The contributions, except **Letter to the Editor** and **Opinion Note**, which are in free format, should be submitted under the general guidelines established by the MJP's authors guide.

Submission dates: Submit your manuscript to revmexfitopatologia@gmail.com from the publication of the call for contributions and until January 31, 2021. Publication online www.rmfm.smf.org.mx in the first quarter of 2021.

Languages of contributions: Spanish, English, Portuguese, French. The Abstract must be written in the language of origin and in English (Summary).
